Expectations (cont.)

- We expect good digital citizenship. You will learn more about this throughout the year.
- Tip #1: Everything you do online is PUBLIC and PERMANENT.
- SCSD2 students will follow all technology rules any time they use the iPad, whether at school or outside of school.

Privacy and Security

- There is NO privacy on SCSD2 owned iPads.
- Your activity will be monitored by the SCSD2 content filter at school and home and by teachers/staff during the school day.
- If you see a security problem (inappropriate image or message), report it immediately to an adult.

Do's...

- Use your iPad to engage in meaningful learning activities.
- Use your iPad to complete assignments and projects.
- Use your iPad to download eTexts of your books, if available.
- Personalize your home screen. Make sure a picture of you and/or your name is visible on the lock screen.

...and Don'ts

- DON'T share your password with anyone or use other students' passwords.
- DON'T change the profile settings on your iPad without permission.
- Don't send inappropriate messages or look for, copy, publish, type, create, display, or forward inappropriate material.

...and Don'ts (cont.)

- DO NOT take a picture or a video of anyone without his or her permission.
- iPads are NOT allowed in the restrooms at any time.

Care Instructions

- Keep the OtterBox case on your iPad.
- Do not scratch, mark, or decorate your case or iPad. No stickers or markers.
- Do not remove the ID sticker under the case.
- Take your charger home and leave it there. Make sure you find a safe place for it where it won't get damaged or lost.

Care Instructions (cont.)

- Charge your iPad every night.
- Keep the iPad away from extreme temperatures (Hot/Cold Cars, for example).
- Keep the iPad away from water and other liquids.

If Damaged or Broken:

- You and your parents will be responsible to pay to repair or replace damaged or lost equipment.
- Do not let anyone borrow your iPad. If someone else is using it and something happens to it, it is still your responsibility.
